

- Village green

Funding

- HCA £660k
- Mortgage £500k
- Sale self-build plots £600k

- Fundraising £8k

Outcome

- 12 homes + 2 under construction + 3 planned
- Further plots to sell
- 13% increase in primary school roll
- Our rents 66% of ave. open market
- 8 homes with children
- 15% increase in village population
